FEES

COVID SAFETY FOR THE CHOIR

1. We ask that if you feel unwell, or if someone in your household tests positive for Covid, you do not attend choir rehearsal.
2. Vox Musica is a mask-friendly organization. Masks are not mandatory at rehearsals, but masking is encouraged to reduce the transmission of the COVID-19 virus. We ask that all singers respect the decisions made by each member of the choir.

ATTENDANCE AND MUSIC

1. As a member you have committed yourself to attend choir rehearsals regularly. Your attendance will typically be recorded by a designated member of your voice section, who then reports to the Membership Secretary and the Music Director (Joanne Collier).
2. If you must miss any rehearsal, please notify Karen (choirkaren@gmail.com) or Joanne (joanneccollier@gmail.com) as soon as possible – preferably in advance of your absence.
3. Please report any change of name, address, phone number or email address to the Membership Secretary in writing.
4. Music must be returned promptly at the end of each term. Any member not returning music within three (3) weeks after the term, or after withdrawing from that term, may be billed for that music.
5. Seating placements may be adjusted by the conductor to improve sound and/or sight lines for singers; choir members are responsible for complying with such requests.

THE ORGANIZATION

Vox Musica Choral Society brings choral music to audiences in Lethbridge and southwestern Alberta and gives the people of this area an opportunity to participate in the public performance of choral works. Vox Musica is registered as a not-for-profit society, with officers elected annually. We are an independent choir forming Southern Alberta's largest mixed choral ensemble.

The Annual General Meeting will be held on **Tuesday, October 3, 2023**, during the last part of rehearsal and is open to all members in good standing.

HEARINGS AND AUDITIONS

The music director may ask for individual hearings from any singer. This is primarily for placement and to ensure the ability to match pitch. Inability to match pitch may restrict access to the choir. Soloists, when required, will be chosen by audition.

REHEARSAL ETIQUETTE

1. Before the first rehearsal of each semester, arrive early (at least 15 minutes before rehearsal start time) to collect music.
2. Be seated before start time at each rehearsal.
3. Please avoid *talking* to your neighbour once rehearsal has begun. This is especially important when the conductor is speaking.
4. Make sure all *electronic devices – including cell phones – are turned off* during rehearsals and concerts.
5. *Bring a pencil* to each rehearsal and use this for marking your music.
6. Have a *water bottle* handy during rehearsals to keep your voice hydrated.

DRESS CODE

Please avoid wearing any scented body products/perfumes/aftershave etc. to rehearsals and concerts. These scents may prevent some members of the choir from singing because of allergies.

Concert Dress is full black, including shoes and socks/hosiery

Women: simple ankle length black dresses or long skirt/blouse or dress pant/blouse combination, with conservative necklines (for uniformity) and sleeves that are elbow length or longer. Clothing should be simple but dressy – no jeans, leggings, sweat pants, t-shirts etc. No large jewelry, please, and no skin visible below the waist (yes, it shows, as we are in full view of some audience members as we process onto the stage).

Men: black pants and black shirts with a black tie. No jeans.

ON STAGE ETIQUETTE

1. File on stage with music in the upstage hand (away from the audience) and stand without speaking until signaled to sit.
2. Acknowledge friends in the audience with a smile only.
3. Stand when the Conductor enters and wait for her signal to be seated again.
4. Use paper clips to turn to the next “stand” request instead of following along with the soloists, as the page turns are distracting for the audience.
5. At intermission sit on signal and then rise to exit when the orchestra does, or when given a signal by a designated choir member.
6. At the end of the concert, the choir may applaud only when the conductor returns with the soloists; the choir’s applause should stop when the conductor indicates the choir and orchestra. Please do not clap for yourself.
7. When singing with an orchestra, the choir remains standing at the end of the concert. Following applause, the choir sits when the orchestra does.
8. The choir stays on stage until given a signal by a designated choir member.
